Resolved - That all who were present be elected a
temporary committee, till the first general meeting of
the club to be held in December or January next.

Proposed by Mr Weir,

Seconded by Mr O'Brien and Resolved -

That Mr J. A. Carbery be appointed President, Mr W. O'K.
White vice-president and hon. sec. and Mr Scott
Moore, Hon Treasurer, and that the subscription be
£1.1.0 per annum now payable for the year 1924.

Proposed by Mr Burns

Seconded by Mr Lindsay and Resolved -

That the committee consist of six members, four to form a quorum, the President, vice president and Hon. Treasurer to be ex-officio members, and that the committee have power to transact all general business and that the club be affiliated to the Irish Kennel Club, and Mr O'Brien be appointed delegate.

The rules and regulations of the English Cocker Spaniel Club were read and considered and several of same adopted with slight alterations.

The President in returning thanks for his election said he would be pleased to do all in ^{for the welfare of the club,} his power and that he would present a cup to the club.

That Mr. Lintke the secretary of the Irish Kennel Club be made an honorary member of the club.

That the following be appointed a committee for the year 1924 - Messrs E. Lindsay, J. W. Lindsay C. J. Wier, P. O'Brien, G. K. Marshall and J. Wiber, and that the officials originally appointed be reappointed and be ex-officio members.

It was decided that the club would guarantee the puppy

class open dog and open bitch class at the coming
championship show to be held on 17 March provided
the Kennel Club gave at least three more classes
and appointed a recognized Spaniel Judge who would
be approved of by the delegate.

Proposed by Mr. Weir,

Seconded by Mr. Marshall and Resolved -

That the cup which the President so kindly presented
should be for the best spaniel in the show to be won
twice in succession, or three times in all by a spaniel
owned and bred by the Exhibitor, and be confined
to members of the Irish Spaniel Club.

The rules and regulations of the club were then
considered and passed - they are as follows:-

1. Name and object

1. The club shall be called "The Irish Spaniel Club".
Its objects shall be to promote the breeding of all
spaniels, to urge the adoption of the true type on breeders
judges &c. as to the standard of excellence by which
all spaniels should be judged; to establish field trials
to offer prizes at Dog Shows; and to adopt such
other means as may be deemed advisable for the
encouragement of the breed.

Establishment and Constitution

2. The Club shall consist of a President, Vice-President
Hon. Secretary Hon. Treasurer and a Committee of not
more than six (in addition to the Hon. President, Vice-President
Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer who shall be ex. officio
members) and an unlimited number of members. Four to
form a quorum at a Committee meeting.

Subscription

3. The Subscription shall be one guinea per annum
payable on the first day of January (or within one
week after election) and no one shall be entitled to
the privileges of membership or to win any special
prizes offered by the Club whose subscription shall be
in arrear on the first of March, and should such
subscription be unpaid on the first day of March it shall
be within the power of the Committee to erase his name
from the list of members. As the payment of subscription
will entitle a member to enjoy every benefit the Club
can impart, so is his acquiescence to the Rules furnished
to him hereby distinctly implied

Election of members

4. Candidates for membership must be proposed by a
member of the Club and elected by the Committee on

the admission of each new member the secretary shall send a notification to that effect and furnish him with a copy of the Rules.

Management

5. The management of, and the property of the club shall be vested in the Committee. The Committee shall also have the power of making by laws, and deciding matters in dispute, or not provided for by the Rules.

General Meetings

6. The Annual General Meeting shall be held at such a time and place as the Committee may appoint. At the said meeting one-third of the Committee longest in office shall retire as also the Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer and all other Hon. officers but shall be eligible for re-election. An extraordinary General Meeting can be called at any time at a weeks notice by the Committee, or by the Secretary on his receiving a requisition duly signed by at least six members. Four members shall form a quorum at any General Meeting.

Resignation and Expulsion of members

7. Any member who may be considered injurious to the Club, or objectionable, is liable to be expelled at a general meeting provided the majority is two-thirds of those voting; any member who wishes to resign must give notice of his intention to the secretary on or before the first day of January, or otherwise he shall be liable for his subscription for the year ensuing. Any member who ceases to belong to the Club, either by resignation or otherwise shall have no claim upon, or be entitled to participate in any of the effects or property belonging to the Club, nor to have any part of his annual subscription for the current year returned to him.

Accounts

8. An account shall be opened in a Bank in the name of "The Irish Spaniel Club" and all Club money lodged to this account, and all payments are to be made by cheque, signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the Secretary after such payments shall have been sanctioned by the Committee.

Prizes and Cups etc.

9. No Prizes, Cups or Subscriptions shall be granted at any Show or Field Trial which is not held under the Rules of the Irish ~~Coast~~ Kennel Clubs, or at which an accepted Judge does not officiate.

Method of Conducting Business

10. At every meeting whether General or of the Committee the Minutes of the last previous meeting shall be read over and confirmed before any other business is gone into.

At least seven days notice except where more is required by any of the foregoing rules, shall be sent of every meeting, and with the notice shall be stated a list of the business to be transacted and copies of all the proposed resolutions.

The President of the Club if present shall preside at every meeting, in his absence the Vice President shall take his place, and in their absence the members present shall elect a Chairman who shall have a casting vote in the event of a tie taking place and whose ruling on any point shall be binding on the meeting.

Annual Report

11. An Annual Report with a statement of the financial position of the Club, duly audited shall be drafted by the retiring Committee, and published and supplied to the members at least seven clear days prior to the General Meeting.

Alteration of Rules

12. The Committee shall have the power to add to or alter any of the foregoing Rules and make new Rules, as occasion may require and such added to or altered or amended Rules shall be observed by members pending their confirmation at a General Meeting.

The Secretary having explained the reason for the short notice convening the meeting - the question of appointing a spaniel judge for the show on 17th March was discussed at length, and a letter from Mr McCarty was read giving his views. Having discussed the matter the following offered to subscribe £2 each towards the expenses of a specialist judge to be got from England Messrs White and Mr Scott Moore, Mr O'Brien £1. (Mr McCarty had already offered to subscribe £2.

It was then proposed by Mr Carbery

Seconded by Mr White and Resolved -

That Mr H. S. Lloyd be asked to judge and failing him Mr Scott, Lesanus English Cocker club and failing both the Secretary was to ask Mr Lloyd to get some one to come over who he knew to be a first class judge.

The Secretary was directed write Mr Lloyd at once.

(A wire was accordingly sent from the hotel at 4.45)

The question of classes was then gone into and

it was decided to have the following for cockers:

Puppy dog or bitch, Maiden dog or bitch, Junior dog or bitch, Graduate dog, graduate bitch, Limit dog, do bitch, Novice dog, do bitch, open dog, do bitch.

Mr O'Brien offered to guarantee a limit class for ^{black} dog or bitch ~~class~~. It was also decided to guarantee an open class dog or bitch for any ~~other~~ spaniel other than Cocker. Messrs Carbery, O'Brien and White subsequently attended at the Kennel Club and gave the Secy particulars of all above classes.

Mrs Scott-Moore was in the Chair, also present Mrs Moore Smith, Mrs Mellan, Mrs Fenrose, Miss Finny, Miss Ferguson, Miss B. Walsh, Miss C.A. O'Brien, Miss M. Cox, Miss D.M. Fagan, The Rev. Bro. G.D. Ryan, Mr Mc Causland & Mr Henry. Apologies were received from Mrs Parker, Miss Travis, Mr & Mrs McKinnay & Mr T.C. Collins.

The Minutes of the previous annual general meeting were read & signed on the proposal of Mr Mc Causland seconded by Bro. Ryan.

The Hon. Treasurer presented the audited balance sheet showing a very satisfactory financial state. 73 members subscriptions amounted to £38-6-6.
